CITY ORDINANCE

Ordinance No. 309

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NOME, TERRITORY OF ALASKA, PROVIDING FOR THE DISPOSITION OF DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE WITHIN SAID CITY:

Be it Ordained and Enacted by the Common Council of the City of Nome as follows:

Section I:

Any dog running at large within the City of Nome is hereby declared a public nuisance per se.

Section II:

Any dog running at large as provided in Section I herein shall on and after the 15th day of July, 1945, be taken into custody by the City of Nome and impounded for a period of time not less than twenty-four (24) hours after capture unless released as hereinafter provided.

Section III:

Any dog not released as herein after provided within the period of twenty-four (24) hours after capture may be put to death.

Section IV:

Any dog impounded as herein provided shall, within the period of twenty-four (24) hours after capture, be released to its owner, master, or custodian upon the payment of the following fees:

For each male dog two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50).

For each female dog ten dollars (\$10.00).

Section V a:

On and after the 1st day of July, 1945, the owner, or master, or custodian of any dog may have such dog registered by the Police Department of the City of Nome, and receive an identification tag for such dog for a fee of one dollar (\$1.00).

Section V b:

The owner, or master, or custodian of any dog registered and tagged as provided herein shall, within a period of twelve (12) hours immediately after any such impounding, be notified of such.

Section V c:

Any owner, or master, or custodian so notified who fails to release any such dog as provided in this Ordinance within a period of twenty-four (24) hours immediately after its impounding has forfeited such dog to the City of Nome.

Section VI:

This Ordinance shall be enforced under the direction of the Nome City Fire and Police Chief.

Section VII:

This Ordinance shall not and is not intended to limit the right to kill any vicious dog running at large as now provided by law.

Section VIII:

All fees collected under this Ordinance shall be turned over to the City Clerk of Nome who shall deposit such fees in the general fund of Nome City.

Section IX:

Any and all Ordinances which may be in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Passed by the Common Council of the City of Nome, Alaska, in regular session assembled the 25th day of June, 1945.
