

The Health Department's Dr. Scorebrand has urged the city to try and assist Mr. Christenson and after several hours discussion the Council and local health officers decided to appeal to the Governor and Public Welfare Department to see if they could aid in the compensation of this man.

After returning from Anchorage Mr. Christenson again developed a positive throat and is at present not working. He has been given some penicillin treatments which have proven successful, and as soon as he has had another test will no doubt be allowed to return to work.
