# **UNRRA** Activities

WASHINGTON, -(A)- A pulledpunch at foreign news censorship went to the Senate last week along with word that UNRRA Director LaGuardia has demanded that the Chinese government overhaul its relief setup.

The relaxed censorship provision, aimed at Russia, was contained in a \$2,700,000 money bill approved by the Senate appropriations committee. Disclosure fo LaGuardia's action came in printed testimony of committee hearings on the measure, which contains \$465,000,000 for LaGuardia's UNRRA.

The testimony disclosed that both F. H. LaGuardia and William H. Clayton, assistant Secretary of State, had strongly urged elimination of a House provision denying UNRRA funds to any country which refuses to permit accredited American press representatives to "enter, observe and report without censorship on the distribution and utilization of relief" in that country.

The committee decided against striking out the amendment. But on motion of Senator Ball (R-Minn.), it decided that none of the UNRRA money in the bill could be spent unless correspondents were permitted to send reports on UNRRA activities "without any deletions or modifications by cen- the safe arrival of a daughter. her condition, he explained, addsorship."

The UNRRA chieftain gave the committee a copy of a telegram he said he had sent to Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek May 29, calling for sweeping changes in the methods of distributing relief goods in that country.

Asserting that "the purpose of this (Relief) is to help the rehabilitation of China and not the financial rehabilitation of warehouses," LaGuardia told Chiang.

"I am sure you will agree that personalities and politics cannot be considered, as the welfare of China concerns all of her people and nothing in this respect can be shaped or guided or diverted to meet the expediency or the specific interest of any individual or group."

## Farmers Uniting to Fight Famine



RACINE, WISC. - Enlistment of the nation's farmers in a new "Battle of Bread" for Europe's starving millions has been started here following a plan advanced in an address by Joe Tucker, vice president of the Massey-Harris company. Tucker has named the organization "Famine Fighters" and plans to recover 28,000,000 bushels of grain, enough to provide a minimum UNRRA bread ration for every person in the United States for five weeks, through the use of selfpropelled combines to open grain fields for harvest.

It is estimated that over 50 per cent of the first swath is lost through opening of fields with other types of equipment. Use of the nation's approximately 8,000 self-propelled combines would yield 28 million additional bushels of grain worth more than \$30,000,000. Implement dealers throughout the country have joined the drive, urging farmers to prevent waste of grain by calling on self-propelled combine owners to open their fields.

Farm groups have already commended the move against trampling of grain into the ground and have pledged support to this new plas of conserving grain in the fight against famine.
