Federal Court Upheld Georgia's Unit Vote System

ATLANTA, Ga. Aug. 26. —(AP)—A three-judge federal court upheld today Georgia's county unit vote system of deciding Democratic Primary elections and refused to invalidate nomination of Eugene Talmage to a fourth term as Governor.

The tribunal dismissed a suit of an Emory University professor and an Atlanta woman civic leader which sought to have the unit system declared void and the nomination of Talmage cancelled.

The judges said it was their unanimous opinion that "an interlocutory injunction should be denied."

The opinion said "these unit votes also appear in the electoral college in choosing a President, so that there have been Presidents elected who did not receive a majority of the popular vote."



