Vetreans may apply at their local VA contact office for application forms and assistance in preparing them.

Information as to a particular USGLI policy status may be obtained from the VA's central office, Washington, D. C. Insurance files for World War I veterans have not been decentralized to the branch offices which handle National Service Life Insurance issued to World War II veterans.

- 4 tablespoons confectioners' sugar
