

## Franco Decorates Mrs. Peron

MADRID, (AP)—Mrs. Juan Peron, attractive wife of the Argentine president, raised her arm today in the falange salute after Generalissimo Francisco Franco decorated her with the cross of Isabel the Catholic.

The 32-year-old former actress, whose Argentine friends call her the South American Mrs. Roosevelt and whose critics declare her a meddler, spoke briefly to a huge crowd outside the national palace.

She compared what she called the "true distributive democracy" of Spain and Argentina to the "blase, deceptive democracy" of other countries which she did not name.

Franco, who accompanied her to the balcony, said Peron had sent to Spain "the heart of Argentina"

## Last Of 1st Div. To Leave China

PEIPING, (AP)—The remainder of the First Division of U. S. Marines, stationed at Tientsin, will complete its evacuation from China within about 10 days, headquarters announced today.

The first group to depart is scheduled tentatively to board ship June 12; a second group, June 16; and the last, June 19.

When the approximately 1,500 men have sailed for Camp Pendleton, Calif., the only marines remaining in Tientsin will be a group of service troops processing surplus property and terminating leases, the Tientsin headquarters announcement said.

## Maritime Peace Seems Hopeful

SAN FRANCISCO, (AP)—The CIO longshoremen and the waterfront employers' association Saturday signed a new contract and looked hopefully to a full year of peace on Pacific coast waterfronts.

Harry Bridges, head of the longshoremen, announced his union agreed to extending the present contract a year, on condition the employers settle with other CIO maritime unions by June 15.

A spokesman for the shipowners said the agreement with longshoremen "should result in prompt agreements with these other seagoing unions."

A growing sentiment for avoiding strikes was reported by observers among the three latter groups, the maritime engineers beneficial association, the American communications association radiomen and the CIO marine cooks and stewards. The independent firemen's union has also to come to terms. All have been offered contract extensions.

The engineers, who have been holding out for a 6 per cent wage increase, announced willingness to arbitrate the demand.

The action of the international longshoremen's and warehousemen's union was expected to have strong influence on the smaller unions in their negotiations.

backing of President Truman, defeated Rep. Roger Slaughter. Axtell subsequently lost the election to Republican Albert L. Reeves, Jr.

The sub-committee Friday completed hearings on a resolution by Senator Kem (R.-Mo.), calling on the Senate to determine whether Attorney General Clark and his aides properly handled complaints about the election. Kem said he thought the investigation should continue.

Senator Taft (R.-Ohio), after firing another round at President Truman in their exchange over economics, asked how the President can oppose a tax cut for individuals when he approved one for corporations in 1945. Taft declared Friday that the President's administration must bear responsibility for "having created all the basic conditions which compel high prices."

The House failed to wind up debate Friday on legislation authorizing the state department to operate a foreign information and education exchange program and won't get around to a vote before the first of this week. Opponents fired briskly at the bill Friday. The suggested program would include the "voice of America" broadcasts.
