REAL OLDTIMER DIES IN DAWSON

Went to Interior in 1897 via St. Michael—Mushed Over Trail

Harry McCrimmon, ill in St. Mary's Hospital for two months, died in Dawson recently as the result of tuberculosis.

The Dawson News said he was one of the very oldtimers, going there in 1897, via St. Michael. The steamer that he was traveling on was frozen in at Circle City, and from that point he and others pulled their sleds and outfits up the frozen Yukon, arriving in Dawson during the winter of '97 and '98.

Mr. McCrimmon mined on French Hill, being associated with James Cody. He next entered into partnership with George Burke and moved to Hunker and Last Chance Creeks, where he was also associated with Ed Blanchfield. When silver was struck on Keno Hill, in the Mayo district, he entered that field, where he remained continually until two years ago, when he returned to his old haunts at Last Chance, again mining on his old placer property. He was brought from there in September and placed in St. Mary's Hospital in Dawson.

Mr. McCrimmon was in his 67th year. He went to Dawson from Butte, Montana. Previous to that he was in Dakota, where he leaves a sister. A second sister resides in Chicago, and a brother, Dan C. McCrimmon, lives in San Francisco. Dan was in the Klondike several years ago.
