RANGE CONDITIONS IN TEXAS ARE EXCELLENT.

EL PASO, Texas, Nov. 1.—Range conditions in the Panhandle of Texas and in other cattle sections of the southwest are said to be excellent and winter feed is expected to be plentiful, according to reports received at the office of the Panhandle & Southwestern Stockmen's Association here. Late fall rains gave the grass an additional growth and farmers are putting quantities of feed for the winter, these reports state.

ENGLISH SHIPPING MEN AGREE RATE OF WAGES.

LONDON, Nov. 1.—The Shipping Controller has set up a Mercantile Marine Conciliation Committee for dealing expeditiously with differences between shipowners and seamen. Various sections of sea-labor and shipowners have been in conference on the possibility of arranging a standard or national rate of wages and as the Ministry of Shipping is satisfied as to the expediency of this reform, they are prepared to create and make effective the necessary machinery.

FARMERS AND BANKERS TO ATTEND CONFERENCE.

PULLMAN, Wash., Nov. —Increasing food and stock supplies of the state will be discussed at a conference of farmers and bankers of Washington to be held here November 9 and 10. State Bank Examiner E. W. Hanson has sent out a call for the meeting.

Encouraging production, distribution problems, conservation of agricultural waste products, and financial assistance in the purchase of livestock and seed are among the topics that will be discussed.
