

OFFICERS CAN'T FIND THORNTON; MAY HAVE FLED

Former Seattle Man Not Found at Ketchikan, Marshal White Announces.

Roy Thornton, Ketchikan roadhouseman indicted recently at Seattle on a conspiracy charge, cannot be located there, it was announced today by U. S. Marshal Albert White. A warrant telegraphed there for his arrest is still held unserved.

Reports received from Ketchikan, the Marshal said, were that Thornton had left that city on a small gasboat on December 23, a day before the warrant for his arrest was received here. Nothing has been heard from him since that time.

Thornton is owner of a fine roadhouse on Tongass Highway near Ketchikan. This was erected about a year ago. He is reported to have other property interests in Ketchikan. An Associated Press dispatch from there said Thornton's friends had announced he would return to Seattle to face the indictment.

Birth Control Threatens Split Among Socialists

LONDON, Dec. 28.—The Socialist Party in England is threatened with a split over birth control.

Proponents of the idea want an understanding that in a future general election, the Socialist Party will adopt birth control teaching as a part of its platform. They say that the advice which is open to any married woman who has the money to pay her private physician should be given the poor woman free of charge.

The executives of the Party, however, reported that birth control was a matter for individual decision and could not be made a party cry. The report, however, was referred back for further consideration.

Kansas Bonus Records Show "Lost Platoon"

TOPEKA, Kan., Dec. 28.—Kansas has a "lost platoon" of 51 world war veterans. They have disappeared without claiming the bonus offered by a grateful commonwealth. Each veteran was entitled to \$300 to \$700, Kansas having awarded a

bonus of a dollar a day for service in the war. By virtue of a law which raises the presumption of death seven years after a person's disappearance, the state bonus board will declare the missing men legally dead and ask the legislature to appropriate money for their beneficiaries.

OLD CHINESE PROVINCE BOWS TO MODERN THINGS

TIENSIN, Dec. 28.—Szechuan province at last is capitulating to modernity and is building highways. Funds for their construction were obtained from the sale of unused temple lands.

One of the most populous and wealthiest provinces in China, it long resisted the introduction of modern ideas. The opposition of the Szechuanese to the proposed great trunk railway in the Yangtze valley, which was to have been built some 16 years ago, led to the revolution.
