## MARINE NEWS

## UNALGA MAY GO TO BERING SEA DURING SUMMER

Orders Received to Join Northern Patrol Until Relieved by Algonquin.

The Unalga will be added to the Bering Sea Coast Guard patrol for several months this summer if present plans are carried to fruition. Capt. John Boedecker has received orders to proceed on the seal patrol April 19 and to follow the seal herd to Dutch Harbor and then join the Bering Sea fleet until relieved about August 1 by the Algonquin, and then return to Juneau.

The regular Bering Sea fleet this year was to consist of the Coast Guard Cutters Haida, Mojave, Bear and Algonquin. Extensive repairs are being made on the Algonquin, and she will be unable to go into service until sometime in July. The Unalga was assigned to the port, yet last year she was away much of the time. After the seal a month when she was sent to Seattle by Senator Wesley L. Jones. Congressman L. H. Hadley and Commissioner Henry O'Malley of the Bureau of Fisheries for a two months' cruise in Northern waters. It required three weeks to get the fisheries investigating party and a short time for repairs at Seattle before she returned to Juneau in September. She was here only about a month when she was sent to Seattle for repairs, and instead of

getting her overhauling at that time she was sent to Port Angeles for a month to relieve the Snohomish. Then she had to undergo annual overhauling, not getting back to Juneau until the middle of January. The new order would seem to indicate that the present year may be a repetition of last year. The period that the Unalga will be away is that in which most of the tourists will come North, and when the passenger traffic is at its peak. It is also the period of the greatest activity in the fisheries industry when there will be most danger from fish pirates.

The program is one, also, that will cause great inconvenience to the families of officers and members of the crew of the Unalga who are located in Juneau.
