And I further certify that the taxes for the year 1918 became delinquent on February 10, 1919; that the total amount of delinquent tax due is \$2.50, total penalty due is 13 cents, total interest due is 60 cents, and the aggregate on the 9th day of February, 1920; that the total amount of the delinquent taxes due is \$47.25, total penalty due is \$2.36 total interest due is \$5.66, and the aggregate of the whole is \$55.27.

ORDINANCE NO 75

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF CORDOVA IN THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA, PROVIDING SICK AND FIXING THE RATE OF FOR THE CARE OF INDIGENT COMPENSATION FOR THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CORDOVA, ALASKA.

That the Town of Cordova assumes no liability for the care of indigent sick or wounded save and except the following cases and under the following procedure:

Section 1. No person shall be entitled to relief from the Town of Cordova unless he or she was at the time of his or her illness or accident a resident within the corporate limits of said town and has been such resident thirty (30) days immediately prior to the date of said accident, unless the common council shall otherwise order.

Section 2. In emergency cases requiring immediate attention, the physician or hospital taking care of the patient shall, within twenty-four (24) hours, of the first call or admission of the patient to the hospital, make a report in writing to the mayor stating that the patient named is under the care of the physician or is admitted in the hospital, giving a brief description of the condition of the patient and stating that it is a case entitled to relief under this ordinance, whereupon the mayor, in conjunction with the health committee of the common council of the Town of Cordova, shall immediately examine into such case and if it is determined that said case is one that should be cared for by the city, they shall immediately authorize said physician or hospital, in writing, to take care of said patient at the expense of the city.

Section 3. In cases other than emergency cases, before any aid shall be given to any patient at the expense of the Town of Cordova, the physician attending the patient, or the hospital wherein the patient is, shall make a report in writing to the mayor, stating that the patient therein named is an indigent, with a brief statement of his or her condition, and that it is a case entitled to relief under this ordinance, whereupon the health committee of the common council of the Town of Cordova shall immediately examine into such case, and if it is determined that the case is one that should be cared for by the city, the mayor shall immediately authorize said physician or hospital, in writing, to take care of said patient at the expense of the city.

Section 4. No charges for expense incurred under the provisions of this ordinance shall be in excess of the expenses actually incurred and the

following schedule of fees shall be the maximum paid by the Town of Cordova:

For medical attention where such medical attention is had outside of a hospital, \$1.50 per visit.

For room and board at hospital, including nurse, medicine, and attending physician, not to exceed \$5.00 per day.

For minor operations where local anesthesia is required, or no anesthesia used, not to exceed \$5.00.

For digital amputation, and other minor operations, not to exceed \$10.

For major operations, not to exceed \$50.00.

Section 5. Any and all moneys advanced by the Town of Cordova for the payment of the hospital or physicians' bills, as herein stated, shall be considered as a loan on the part of the Town of Cordova and nothing herein shall prevent the Town of Cordova from recovering such amount so advanced, in the event that the patient for whose benefit such payment is made becomes financially able to repay such loan and the city attorney is hereby instructed to collect for the use and benefit of the Town of Cordova any such sums which may be recoverable.

Federal Power Commission

In compliance with the Federal Water Power Act (41 Stat., 1063) notice is hereby given that the Alaska Public Utilities, Cordova, Alaska, and Messrs. Lincoln Wain and W. T. Young, P. O. Box No. 6, Nashville, Tennessee, have applied for preliminary permits for power development on Power Creek from Eyak Lake to a point approximately 2 miles upstream therefrom. Any objection against granting such permits, or requests for hearings thereon, together with any briefs, reports, or other data for which consideration is desired, should be submitted on or before May 16, 1921, to the Executive Secretary, Federal Power Commission, Washington, D. C.
