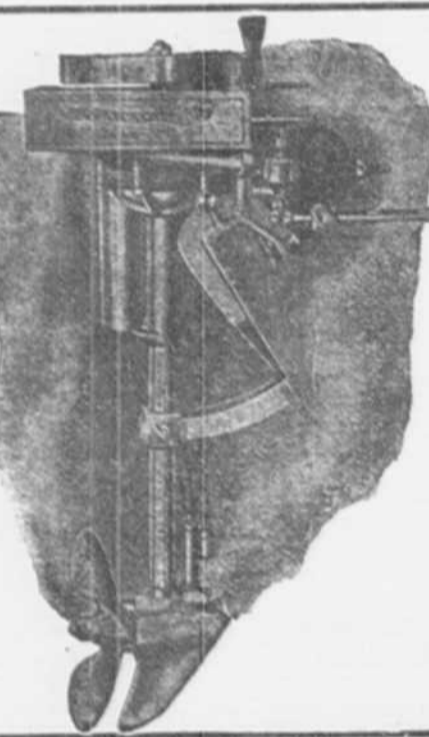

News from All Parts of the Northland

SEATTLE, Nov. 9.—Charles E. Dunlap, a local druggist in charge of a store on Pike street, died yesterday of a self-inflicted wound because he had been arrested and charged with selling liquor in violation of the law.

SEATTLE, Oct. 30.—Sneak thieves entered a room occupied by Frederick W. Best, of Nome, at the Frye hotel and obtained gold nuggets weighing nearly fourteen ounces and valued at \$260, some time Tuesday night.
