FAIRBANKS SCHOOLS LARGEST ENROLLMENT

FAIRBANKS, Sept. 25.—The Fairbanks school was opened yesterday with the largest enrollment of pupils ever on hand at the opening of school in the history of the town. There were an even 200 pupils present. Miss Smith, in the First grade, had 41; Miss Stevenson, in the Second grade, had 27; Mrs. Tupper, in the Third and Fourth grades, had 39; Miss Carpenter, in the Fifth and Sixth grades, had 36; Miss Moody, in the Seventh and Eighth grades, had 27; and in the high school there were 30 pupils. Last year at the opening of school there were but 165 pupils present. This is the highest enrollment, regardless of the season of the year, ever known in Fairbanks.—Ex.

CARIBOU ARE NOW RUNNING IN THOUSANDS

FAIRBANKS, Oct. 16.—The annual run of caribou is now on. At least, that is the report which reaches Fairbanks, brought down by arrivals from the Big Chena Hot Springs. The information is to the effect that thousands of caribou are going south along the divides at the head of the Big Chena river, the informant's statement being to the effect that fully 1,500 pass within gunshot of the Big Chena Hot Springs hotel every day.

Nearly every year witnesses the run of the caribou at the head of the Big Chena. Some years they go south by other routes further beyond the Big Chena and nearer the Eagle country, while at times they cross nearer to Fairbanks. One year large numbers of the animals were slaughtered on Fairbanks creek, when the run happened to come by that way.
