**BASE ROADWORK STARTS**

Commander Coryell of the Naval Air Station Base informed the Mirror that work on the Base road would be started on July 1st, by the Navy.

Appropriations in the amount of \$182,000 had been procured for the project estimated at 5½ miles, from the town limit to the Base. Requisition has been made for the necessary equipment and immediately upon its arrival shortly, work will be rushed to completion by Fall.

The road will be a full 20 ft. wide, macadamized with crushed gravel that has been washed by a machine now constructed for the purpose.

He also stated that the Navy would take over the maintenance of this entire highway which will exist 4½ miles within the naval reservation and 1 mile in the Territory supervision.

Adequate turnouts for increased safety would be the first part of the work, he said, enabling the heavy equipment to work on the road without endangering the travelling public.
