

# News From All Parts of Alaska

The territory has been awarded a captured German cannon for its record in the last Liberty Drive.

The Beluga Whaling company reports the capture of 55 of these precious mammals the past season.

Anchorage public schools opened with 120 pupils, a falling off from last year.

The McNally and Mattland coal mines at Bluff point, near Valdez, have been closed down for the season.

The Seward public school opened with a total enrollment of 68 pupils.

After serving for 11 years Dr. Gable has resigned his position for the White Pass & Yukon railway at Whitehorse.

The Seward Gateway says that more residences have been patented in that city this year than any time previously.

Seward papers state that during the past three months 47 residents of the city have returned from the states and they are going to remain. Fifty eight former residents of Whitehorse have returned from the States. More would come if they had the fare.

Mrs. Alice Anderson, prominent in educational lines in southeastern Alaska has taken a position as government school teacher at Chignik.

Frank J. Cleary, original staker of Cleary creek in the Fairbanks district recently visited in Anchorage after spending the summer in the Broad Pass district.

Olat W. Nelson, a homesteader in the Matanuska district near Anchorage died recently, as the result of injuries received while working on a pile-driver at the gorge at dock at Anchorage.

Ed. Henning, a well known Anchorage citizen and former employee of Brown and Hawkins, broke his right leg while working in a store in the Talkeetna mine.

A school was opened with a large number of pupils.

George Preston the lead manager for the N. C. Company, left Fairbanks recently for the Tokovana and the surrounding mining districts.

Mr. and Mrs. George Armstrong, pioneers of the Yukon district, have left Whitehorse and will make their home in the States.

A Yukon man has had great success in preparing kippered grayling for winter use. The grayling abounds in the interior and are said to be better than the finest salmon.

Wm. Kelly, 12 year old son of Jack Kelly was accidentally killed at Lake Bay in September. He was picking berries and stepped on a log which rolled on him, crushing his skull.

A suggestion is made that some of the uninhabited islands of southeastern Alaska be turned into game preserves for the propagation of game animals and birds.

The Cuross Island Mining and Milling Company, a Washington corporation, has filed its papers with the territorial secretary and will operate a mine near Valdez.

After spending 20 years in the U. S. D. H. McDonald has returned to the Willow creek district to hunt for a ledge of gold bearing rock he discovered on the lower end of the creek in 1899.

Although there are rich properties on the Salmon river, Ketchikan papers say that no one should run away with the idea that it will be a big camp until much work is done in road building and other improvements.

A suit for \$1,800,000 damages has been filed at Juneau against the Chichagof mine by John Trupelo, who alleges the company attempted to have him adjudged insane in order to secure the mining property from his guardian. The company alleges there has been no gold of commercial value taken from the mine.

Jim Hulse, the 17 year old son of Ben Hulse of Wrangell was seriously injured while working on his father's boat. He attempted to siphon a drum of distillate into the boat's tank and the liquid went down his throat,

burning his lungs and the membrane of his stomach. He was in great pain for a while.

The Wrangell Sentinel claims to have the original jazz orchestra in town.

The citizens of Wrangell recently raised \$110 for the Armenian relief fund.

Tom Davin was arrested at Juneau for assault and battery on the person of C. H. Passelk.

Federal employees of Ketchikan and the surrounding district have the union bug and recently organized and sent a petition to the National Federation for admission. Members of the forestry, immigration, customs and lighthouse service are in the new organization.

Wm. Britt, territorial senator, has received his commission as Norwegian consul for the First and Tidal divisions of Alaska. On account of charges made against him a year ago the State department cancelled his exequatur until his record could be examined. These charges were found to be untrue.

The Anchorage Advisory Board recently held a meeting to discuss the advisability of incorporating the city, under the law passed by the last legislature for the incorporation of towns in government reservations.

The laborers of the New England cannery at Ketchikan struck for higher wages. They have been receiving 65 cents an hour and 75 cents for overtime and Sundays. The men demanded 65 cents an hour, time and a half for overtime and double time for Sundays.

Harry Finimous, for 19 years on the Yukon and in Alaska most of the time with the U. S. Signal Corps has returned to Fairbanks after a two years absence with the army in France. He was once assistant postmaster at Fairbanks under John J. Chubb.

An unknown man was drowned in the Koyukuk river according to the captain of the steamer Reliance who says the man was washed off his feet while trying to ford the stream and never came to the surface again. He was loaded with a heavy pack which held him down. The victim was enroute to the Chandler country at the time of the accident.

The fishing boat Olive of the Hidden Inlet cannery was swamped recently by having too much fish aboard. The Olive had been loaded to the pinnacel line owing to the captain expecting to meet the cannery tender. The tender was delayed and the boat started for the cannery. The boat began sinking and was beached by the captain, after the big seine and other articles had been jettisoned to relieve the weight.

At a conference with the U. S. shipping board recently the officers and crews of the Pacific coast vessels secured a wage increase that places them on the same basis as mariners on the Atlantic coast. The pay varies according to the tonnage of the vessel. Under the new agreement captains will get from \$230 to \$412 a month; first officers will get \$216 to \$241; second officers from \$187 to \$212; third officers from \$158 to \$165. The agreement is in force until August 1, 1920.

E. F. Butler, a pioneer of Ketchikan, recently returned north after spending several weeks in Seattle, following his return from Unimak Pass, where he was appointed assistant keeper of the light. Mr Butler says that during the year he was at the light he received but two mails, and a letter mailed to him in February was re-

ceived the day he left. He believes the government should improve the mail service.

The new auto fire truck recently purchased by the town of Cordova is now ready for instant service, and the following facts, furnished by Alderman MacConnell, will give some idea as to its capacity for fire fighting.

The machine is the product of the American La France Engine Company. Its equipment consists of 1900 feet of 2 1/2-inch hose, one forty-gallon steel chemical tank, made of one-piece, seamless, cold drawn steel; 200 ft. of three-fourths inch chemical hose, tested to 400 pounds pressure; two three-gallon Esbeck extinguishers; one twenty-foot rapid ladder; one twelve foot roof ladder. Its cost, f. o. b. Seattle, was \$2,100.
