Whence Came the Gordons?

In the absence of definite data one is left to ground a theory of the initial inspiration of the Gordons on the undisputed tradition of their French origin. In the department of Lot, in the southwest of France, there is a townlet of 3,000 souls, still known, like the Kin-cardineshire fishing village, by the name of Gourdon. France believes to this day that Gourdon is the seat of a great hidden gold treasure which King Clovis buried there in 511. A chance find in 1842 gives some credence to the belief. At any rate it might be taken as symbolic of the gift of the race of men which France made to this country.

The province of Aquitaine, in which Gourdon is a tiny dot, was just the place to breed a hardy, adventurous race, for it had long been the battleground of southern France, swept by successive hordes from the north. As early as the eighth century a duke of Gourdon was constable of France, and the town touched English history when Richard the Lion fell at Chalus by the hand of a soldier called Bertram de Gourdon.—Blackwood's Magazine.

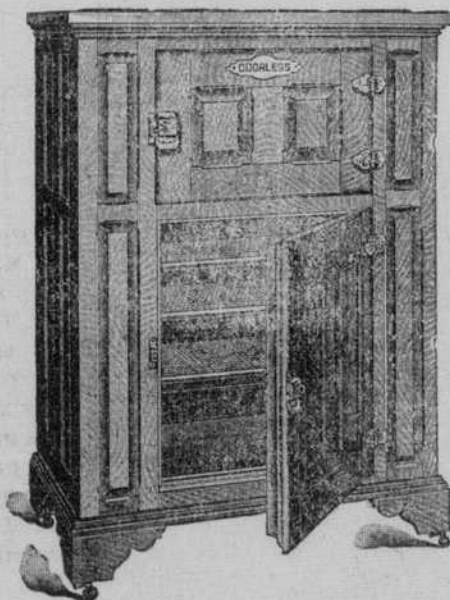

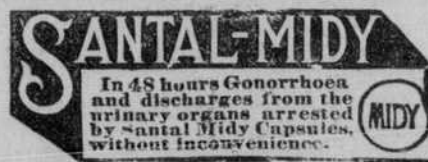
