Wages and Cite Also Higher
Cost of Living.

Chicago, Dec. 16.—Pullman porters have sent a petition to the general manager of the Pullman company asking for an increase in wages. The petition says:

"The growing tendency of the traveling public either to discontinue altogether, or to reduce to one-half or less, the gratuities with which they formerly rewarded Pullman porters who merited such consideration, and the high cost of living generally, have forced us to come through you to the Pullman company, begging for some relief."

NOTABLE DEAL IN LUMBER BUSINESS

Newport, Tenn., Dec. 15.—Announcement is made that the control of the Pigeon River Lumber Company and its ally, the Tennessee and North Carolina Railroad Company, has passed

from a syndicate headed by C. I. James of Baltimore and J. D. Lacy of Chicago, to a Philadelphia corporation, headed by William Whitmer. The deal involves the transfer of a large lumber plant at Cresmont, Tenn., and 55,000 acres of timber lands in the Tennessee-Carolina mountain region. The Tennessee and North Carolina Railroad may be extended.
