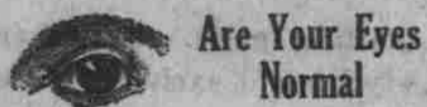

Whereas, The Southern California Edison Company indicates their willingness to undertake the immediate development of the project, giving due consideration to storage for irrigation purposes, flood control and other issues, as well as efficient power development and it being a demonstrated fact that said company has achieved remarkable success with such problems and are at present, expending considerable sums in the preliminary engineering work on this project, thereby showing their earnest intent; therefore,
