Now therefore be it resolved, that the said petition be granted and that the road designated by the plat and description attached to said petition be hereby declared a Public Road and a County Highway, and the right-of-way of said road be hereby declared to be the property of the County of Navajo, Arizona.

A personal bond for the Merchants and Stock Growers Bank in the sum of \$40,000.

Upon motion duly carried the Board recessed until 9 a. m. November 8th, in order to meet with a delegation of taxpayers from Winslow, in relation to the Winslow-Reservation road.

November 8th, 1921. Pursuant to a recess taken on the 7th, the Board met this date in regular session. All present. Judge Sloan was retained as special counsel to assist the County Attorney in the prosecution of the officers of the First National Bank of Albuquerque in relation to the failure of the Holbrook State Bank, of Holbrook, Arizona.

A petition signed by ten or more taxpayers of Winslow praying for the establishment of a public road beginning at the Fur and Feather Wash and thence running in a northerly direction via Chandler Butte to the south line of the Moqui Indian Reservation, near Comar Springs, which said road will be on a route from the Moqui Indian Reservation to the town of Winslow, was presented to the Board asking that viewers be appointed to view out the proposed route.

After being assured by the Winslow delegation that in case the viewers should recommend the proposed route, and abandon the present road on which considerable of the money set aside for the building of a road to the Reservation has already been expended, that they, the delegation would be responsible for the money thus lost, and if the Board would select a set of impartial viewers to look over the proposed route and compare it with the approved line that they would be willing to abide by the decision of the board of viewers. The Board of Supervisors agreed to appoint three viewers outside of the town of Winslow.

James H. Frost was appointed County Engineer for the sole purpose of viewing the proposed route. Jones Grigsby and Chas Ballard were chosen as viewers to assist Engineer Frost.

There appearing to be no further business upon motion duly carried the Board adjourned.
