

Sydney Scott Dead

One of the best known citizens of Navajo County passed away at the California Hospital in Los Angeles, California, Wednesday evening at 7 o'clock of Melanoma. While the death was expected for by the relative of the deceased, it was not expected so soon and at the time of his death there was no relative with him except his daughter Loraine. Mrs. Scott wired Mrs. J. C. Zuck to notify her uncle James and to ask him to come to Los Angeles. James Robert and George Scott went to Los Angeles reaching there Saturday morning. The interment took place in the Bosedale Cemetery, Sunday the 27 of November. The deceased was one of the best known men of Arizona as he was engaged in the wool growing business both at Holbrook and Phoenix. He had lived in Navajo County for the last nine years and was well and favorably known to most every one in the County. He was 54 years old at the time of his death. He was born at Mohawk, Oregon, while living in that native state he was engaged in stock raising most of the time, part of the time he was in the employ of the United States. He was married to Miss Malissa Boggs in 1876 and has but one child, Miss Loraine surviving him, his wife dying in 1905. There were five brothers and two sisters, Raleigh Scott the oldest living in Oregon and two sisters Mrs. Jennie Tayou and Mrs. Lucy Scarborough living in California and three of the brothers in this County.

Mr. James and George all known and respected citizens. The deceased was a member of the Woodman of the World. The many friends of the daughter and relatives mourn with them in their loss of a kind brother and a loving and trusting father.
