BY ORDER OF THE COMMITTEE.

A shooting scrape disturbed the usual Monday quiet of Globe on Thursday. Juan Romero, a young Mexican, attacked Jesus Beas, a freighter, on Main Street in front of the Old Dominion store, with the foul intent of filling him full of holes. Romero proved a very poor marksman, or else was badly rattled, as he fired three shots at close range without hitting his man. Beas, although unarm'd, displayed grit; he closed in on his murderous adversary after the third shot, took Romero's pistol away and struck him once on the head with it, when bystanders interfered.

Romero was immediately arrested, and given a hearing before Justice Geo. Strong. Five witnesses testified to the shooting, as here detailed, and Romero was held in the sum of \$1,000 to await the action of the next grand jury. The prisoner alleges as provocation for the shooting that Beas owed him \$2.50, which the latter denies.

DEATH OF PAULINE CUSHMAN.

Major Pauline Cushman, who gained notoriety during the war of the rebellion, as a spy for the Union forces, died in San Francisco, Dec. 2nd, from an overdose of morphine. She was a woman of good education, bright intellect, forceful and impetuous.

Born in New Orleans of French and Spanish parents, she early went on the stage and gained some reputation as an actress. In 1863 she quit the stage to enter the service of the Federal government as a spy, her Southern origin and associations giving her peculiar advantages for securing information of the plans and movements of the Confederate forces. She was suspected after a time, arrested by General Morgan and turned over to General Forrest, and it is said, narrowly escaped hanging.

After the war, her husband, Chas. C. Dickinson, a Union soldier, and several children born of the union, having died, Pauline Cushman came West and led an adventurous and checkered existence until she married Jerro Fryer, of Casa Grande, Sheriff of Pinal county, Arizona.

Prior to that time, in 1878, she was a resident of Globe, and a number of years afterward made a short visit here. She is remembered by all old residents, many of whom have kindly recollections of her generous and charitable nature, and her habit of the suffering and privation of her later years, and of her sad end. The funeral took place Dec. 4th in San Francisco, under the auspices of Lincoln Post, G. A. R., and the Woman's Relief Corps.
