THE PROPOSED LEASE LAW.

The introduction of the bill providing for leasing the grazing lands will be of special interest to the cattlemen of Arizona who now occupy the public lands for grazing purposes. The bill is a measure which has been passed several times before for consideration during the pending of former similar measures for leasing the public domain. The passage of the proposed law would be good in one respect; it would lessen the amount of cattle stealing now going on in Arizona. The man with an iron and recorded brand could not then begin business without a hoof, as his often been done. Cattlemen could protect themselves by leasing grazing lands for their herds and keeping other people off of it. But the ultimate result would be to place the entire ranges in Arizona in the hands of the big cattle companies. If they were not able to secure original leases to all the desirable land, they would soon obtain possession by buying out the smaller owners. So far as the public is concerned, that would be of no great importance, as it would require about as many rangers to care for and handle the cattle under one ownership as where divided up into small holdings. In the past, however, the small owners have opposed any lease law, and in Arizona many of the larger cattle holders have also opposed the measure which is now proposed. It has been suggested that two and three cents per acre is entirely too high for range land in Arizona; it is estimated that no range now occupied in Arizona would sustain more than one animal for every one hundred acres. This would mean a grazing tax of \$2 to \$3 per head, and no one could afford to pay such a price. Range land in Texas is leased for four to six cents per acre, but there the grass is good and twenty acres will maintain one animal. This question should be looked into carefully before any law is passed which would apply to Arizona. Many of the cattlemen would not doubt prefer to lease the land and control it, but they could not afford to pay \$2 to \$3 per head for the privilege of the average range lands in Arizona. The bill introduced in congress has the endorsement of the National Live Stock Association, and Arizona cattlemen would do well to inform themselves of what is doing and take steps to prevent the application of a harmful range law in this territory.

On the other hand, there is objection on the ground that to put the grazing lands in the hands of large cattle companies would exclude the small settler from establishing a home on present unoccupied land, and would interfere with the settling and development of some parts of the territory.

A Grand Rapids furniture man began advertising his office furniture six years ago, spending \$10 a month for newspaper ads. Gradually his advertising brought such results that he now spends more than \$4,000 a year for space in the leading newspapers. He has succeeded in winning a trade from other manufacturers which they could have had by advertising in their home newspapers. In this day men have to advertise not only to secure more business but to save what trade they may have.

GENERAL WEYLER was much abused in the newspapers on account of his concentration camps in Cuba, but Weyler looked upon war as a cruel thing at best, and doubtless feels vindicated when he hears that the British have established concentration camps in South Africa, and that the Americans are likely to pursue the same policy in Luzon.

THE question of women in saloons is one which concerns the homes of Bisbee. If the people say no the warblers will have to go. Tucson and Phoenix had a hard fight to turn the women out of the saloons, but they were sent back when the sentiment of the people became determined.

THE flurry in the copper market in no way affects Bisbee, as the stream of red metal coming from the smelters continues undisturbed. Copper will have to go considerably lower before it stops the progress of the bigger copper mines in Arizona.

MARK HANNA is now engaged in teaching capital and labor how to get along amicably, but it will be hard for the average laboring man to find the gas while Mark is shifting the shells.

THE past year has been a record breaker in the growth of Bisbee, but the probabilities are that 1902 will see even greater improvement in growth.
