The first regular train to cover the entire distance from Williams to the Grand Canyon made the trip on last Tuesday. The road-bed is in first-class condition and a good rate of speed is maintained the entire length of the line. A change has been made in the schedule for the running of trains, which, while it is much better for the traveling public, so far as making connections are concerned, greatly reduces the revenue to be derived by the local hotel from this class of trade. Beginning yesterday the train for the canyon left Williams at 7 p. m., arriving at the rim at 10 o'clock. This morning the train leaves there at 8:30, arriving here at 11:20.

Mr. Young says that handsome and commodious new brick buildings are nearing completion in Williams and that all the merchants will soon be able to do as much, if not more business than before the general conflagration which nearly wiped the entire town off the map a few months ago. He says the Anita Consolidated Copper company has resumed work and that heavy and scientific development of its mines will be in order for some time to come.—Albuquerque Citizen.

### OFFICIAL NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS OF COCONINO COUNTY, ARIZONA TERRITORY.

FLAGSTAFF, ARIZONA, Sept. 6, 1901.

FIRST, That the Duplicate Assessment Roll of the County for 1901 is now in his possession for the collection of the taxes levied.

SECOND, That taxes will be delinquent on the third Monday of December, next; thereafter, and unless paid on that day, or prior thereto, five per cent will be added to the amount thereof as penalty.

THIRD, The time and place at which payment of taxes may be made is from now until the third Monday in December, 1901, at the office of the Treasurer and Tax Collector, in the town of Flagstaff, Arizona.
