GREENLEE COUNTY GIVES LAMAR COBB SPLENDID VOTE

English Wins the Nomination for Sheriff Over J. R. Wester For Sheriff in a Close Contest

 The election passed off quietly throughout the county. Workers were early at the polls and the contest for the democratic nomination for Sheriff, Supervisors and Assessor evoked the most interest.

Hon. Lamar Cobb, Greenlee county's candidate for Representative, who returned home Monday afternoon, was given a splendid vote in Greenlee county, receiving a total of 481 democratic votes. Cobb also led all other candidates for Representative in Cochise but the strength of Hayden in Maricopa county, which went almost solid for him, giving their candidate a majority of more than a thousand, was too much for either Cobb or Winsor to overcome in the remaining counties of the territory. Probably the greatest interests in Greenlee county was taken in the contest for Supervisors, Sheriff and Assessor. B. F. Billingsley, of Duncan, led the ticket, Campbell second, Hampton, third and Croub fourth.

For Sheriff English received the nomination over Wester by margin of eighteen votes.
 For Assessor James Kerby defeated James Harvey. Kerby received 388 votes Harvey 279.

Contrary to expectations in some quarters there is a scarcity of "sore heads" among the democrats. The result has been accepted by the de-

feated candidates as an expression of the will of the majority at a fair election and judging from the expressions heard the Democrats propose to support the ticket nominated on Tuesday with more enthusiasm than ever before witnessed in a political campaign in Greenlee county.

The Republican party polled a comparatively small vote in Greenlee county, likewise the Socialists. The only contest was for Supervisors where J. L. T. Watters of Duncan was defeated by a narrow margin.

When the sample ballots made their appearance it was discovered that the blank spaces on the Socialist ticket, whereby members of that party could write in the names of their candidates for county officers, had been omitted. It was the desire of the Socialists to nominate a legislative ticket which they did by writing the names of Doudna, Ghizoni and Whitacre on the ballot and the returns were properly made to the Supervisors.

Casino Hall Thursday Night Held a Large Number of Local Republican Enthusiasts

Shortly after 8 o'clock Thursday evening Casino hall was comfortably filled with local republicans and the meeting was opened by Chairman Weiss, who stated the object of the call was in honor of Jas. Fisk, republican candidate for state treasurer.

The first speaker was C. C. Daubert who gave a lucid account of his life's history and why he was a republican. He spoke clearly on the principles of republicanism and while his remarks were not of a political nature, their significance could not be misconstrued.

After Mr. Daubert came C. P. Dunn, county candidate for supervisor. Mr. Dunn took the supervisorship from a business standpoint and his remarks were well received. Then came Mr. Fisk who made a short and terse talk along the lines of the responsibility of the first treasurer of the great state of Arizona.

Mr. Merritt was then introduced and his remarks were greeted with much applause and enthusiasm. L. Kearney was then called upon and in a forcible manner he dwelt on the duties of a judge of the superior court to which office he was nominated by his party. and eloquent manner made the talk of the evening. He dwelt upon politics briefly, paid an eulogy to Mr. Fisk, and then landed a package for good roads. This question he made a paramount one for Arizona and stated his cause in such a clear manner that it was apparent that every good citizen of the new state should make it his duty to boost first, last and all the time for good highways.

After the speaking refreshments were served in the buffet, where everyone refreshed and enjoyed themselves. The enthusiasm ran high and altogether the meeting was a grand success.
