Pursuant to statutory requirements the Board of Supervisors of Navajo County met this 3rd day of April, 1922, in regular session.

The Board then proceeded to audit the following claims which were allowed and ordered paid.

The demands of John L. Sweeney for salary as Justice of the Peace of Winslow from and including January, 1921, to and including March, 1922, were deferred until our next regular meeting.

On account of complaints being made to the Board of Supervisors to the effect that the accounting in the Winslow School District, for the school funds is defective, the Board ordered a special examination of the records.

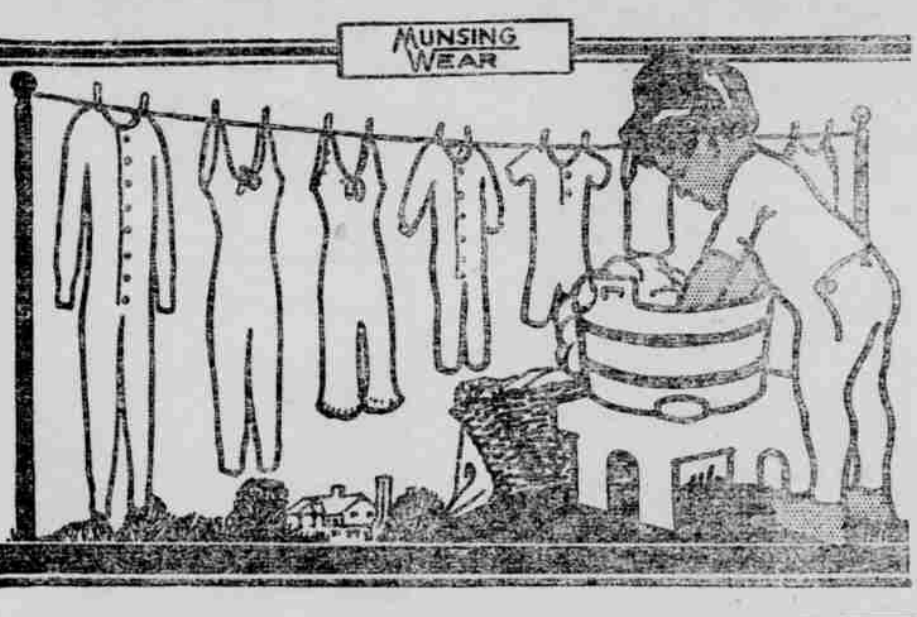
