For district attorney G. W. Swain, the present incumbent, is again the nominee. He performed his duties faithfully and has been rewarded by a re-nomination at the hands of his party.

E. W. Perkins of Tombstone is the Republican nominee for Recorder. He is well and favorably known all over the county for his sterling worth and is a man well fitted to assume the duties of the office to which he aspires.

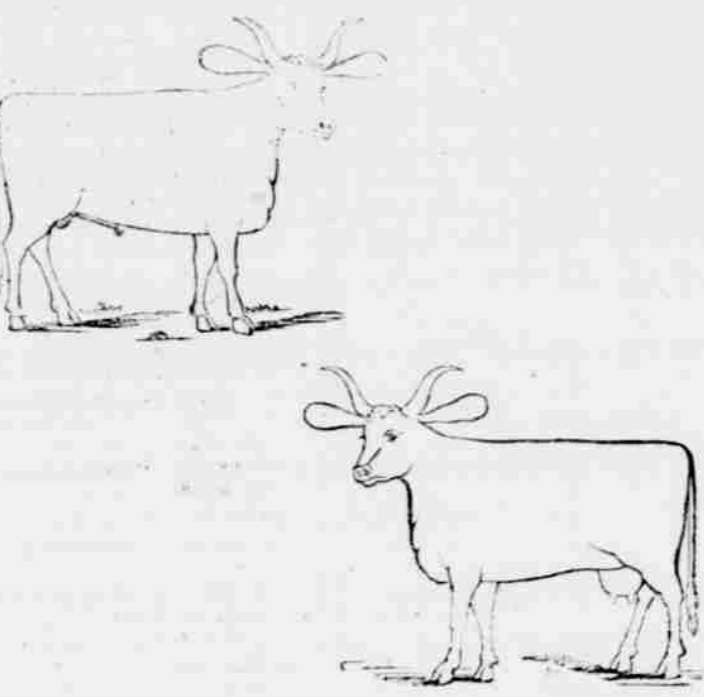
