Council Meeting

The Havasupai Tribal Council met last Saturday in Supai with five members present and they were: Juan Sinyella, Edith Putesoy, William Little Jim, Clark Jack, and Lemuel Paya. Among the business matters discussed were: 1. The Council voted to hold the annual election on January 2nd, 1960. 2. The budgets for the Tourist & Trading Co. Enterprises were approved. 3. A permit for Mrs. Carma Lee Smithson to do research work on the Reservation for 1960 was approved. 4. It was voted to hold the annual Christmas Feast on Christmas Day. 5. The Council discussed the proposed helicopter service into the Canyon by Mr. Dungan of Hude Park. The proposal was tabled until next meeting. 6. The Council wants the Extension Agent to come from Valentine to prune the fruit trees. 7. It was voted to ask that proper steps be taken to have the Havasu Creek stocked with fish by Springs of 1960 so that fishing in the Creek would attract more tourists. More matters were taken care of but there was not time enough to finish and the Meeting was over at 7 P. M.
