CHIEF ENGINEER RETURNS.

Surveying Parties Starting From Numerous Points on New Line.

Chief Engineer E. A. McFarland of the Cananea, Yaqui River & Pacific railroad was in town yesterday, having returned the previous evening from the State of Sinaloa. From Mazatlan Mr. McFarland started an engineering party surveying the route north to Culiacan, a distance of 130 miles. Construction work on the route being surveyed will start at Mazatlan in about four months. Another party of surveyors will pass through here going south in a few days. They will survey the route from Mazatlan to Tepic, in the territory of Tepic, a distance of about 250 miles. From Guadalajara, capital of the State of Jalisco, still another crew of engineers will be started to survey the route northwest to Tepic, thus connecting the lines through from Nogales to the City of Mexico. Mr. McFarland estimates the time it will take to complete the work at about seven years.

Miss O'Daly, sister of the late William O'Daly, returned last night from Imuris. No details have yet been received of the murder of Mr. O'Daly.

RIVERA IS HELD.

Mexican Desperado in Hands of Immigration Officials.

Luis Rivera, the Mexican desperado and murderer captured two weeks ago by Rangers Olds and Coffee, and who was taken to Tucson last Friday on a writ of habeas corpus, to appear before Judge Campbell at that place, is now a federal prisoner. When he arrived at Tucson he was arrested by Chief of the Immigration Bureau, Webb on a warrant sworn out before a United States Commissioner charging him with being an alien criminal. A request has been sent to the authorities of the Altar district of Sonora, Mexico, asking for the man's record. An effort will be made to make arrangements with the Altar authorities, who want Rivera for murder, to be at the line when the man is deported. It is reported here that Rivera has admitted at Tucson that he is the Altar murderer.

Double Murder at Silver Bell.

Dave Hawkins and James White, miners, were murdered at Silver Bell Monday night. The men were out for a stroll and met three Mexicans, one of whom did the shooting. Hawkins died in a few minutes and White died next morning. Two other miners saw the shooting, but in the darkness could not recognize the murderer. He has not been captured.

Residence Burned.

Wednesday afternoon the residence of Mr. A. L. Pellegrin was destroyed by fire. The building was insured in the Firemen's Fund company and yesterday Mr. Pellegrin received from Mr. Henry Levin, local agent for the company, a check for the amount. Immediately upon receiving the money Mr. Pellegrin contracted with contractor Bowman for the reconstruction of the building.

Secured Gas Franchise.

Messrs E. Titcomb of Nogales, W. N. Hamaker of Los Angeles, J. L. Brown and John A. Henry of Douglas, by a vote of the people of Douglas Tuesday, were granted the franchise for the installation of a gas plant in that city. Work upon the new enterprise will commence shortly.

At Territorial Fair.

Mr. H. C. Lockett, of Flagstaff, has been appointed superintendent of the sheep and goat department of the fair. As the sheep men of the northern part of the territory drive their flocks down here in the early winter, it will be convenient for them to attend the fair and a good exhibit of this leading industry is promised.
