SERIOUS? CERTAINLY!

Last week the Border Vidette threw a cat fit over the organization of the Joint-Statehood Association of Santa Cruz county, and thought it a pity that a matter so serious should be treated with such levity. The Vidette may depend upon it that the issue of jointure is a serious matter—very serious; but the levity is all upon that side of the house. The advocates of jointure are in deadly earnest, and they are in the contest to win. They are opening the eyes of the people to the abnormal conditions under which Arizona is laboring, and that statehood is the only remedy. Men are beginning to think and as fast as one does a bit of good, hard ratiocination upon the subject he comes over to the cause of jointure. When such men as Frank Proctor, Ed. Titcomb, T. D. Casanega, Geo. D. Gross, George W. Atkinson, A. L. Peck, I Burgoon, W. G. Scoville, Con O'Keefe, Ray Ferguson, R. D. George, L. Ephraim, D. G. Chalmers, (and many more who have signed the membership roll of the association) with all the varied and important interests they control, unite by spontaneous incentive in such a movement it means something. One meaning to the declaration to which they have subscribed is that there is not the unanimity of sentiment against jointure in Arizona that has been alleged. Another meaning is that the movement in favor of jointure is growing; for a year ago all but two or three of the gentlemen named were hostile to the proposition, yet now embrace it as the best for Arizona. Then they were ruled by a sentiment; now they are actuated by good, substantial business motives. They see that it is business for the people of Arizona to frame a constitution, assume the duties and responsibilities of self government, and that it is business to have the people of New Mexico help them in the great work.

The tiny snow ball of opinion THE OASIS started down the mountain nearly two years ago, is steadily rolling and gathering size, weight, speed and force. By another year it will be an avalanche of public opinion, and will bury from sight forever all who shall have the temerity to stand in the way.
