AN APPEAL FOR GOOD ROADS.

The following, from the El Paso Herald, is appropriate, and applies to the territories as well as to older settled communities. Good roads much as good schools, are a sure index to the progressive intelligence of the people, and the town or village whose citizens are awake to their own material interests to that extent that they continuously keep in good repair the public roads leading to and from their borders, are sure to reap the reward which follows in the wake of such advanced ideas. The Herald says:

"We mortals accept the tremendous advances of the nineteenth century with the utmost equanimity, seldom stopping to think of the great changes that have taken place within a generation. Such is the ease of communication by wire and rail at this day that more than ever before the village communities of the country are coming to take on the characteristics of suburbs of great cities. In one particular the United States is far behind the times, to her own great loss: that is in road building. Roughly speaking, any form of communication is cheaper than traveling over our ordinary roads, and necessarily the farmer and dweller in outlying districts, must suffer most from this condition. A campaign for good roads ought to have the support of the mass of the people in any community. Perhaps one of the greatest drawbacks is the unfortunate but generally admitted fact that the road fund is usually legitimate prey for all political shysters and dishonest contractors in the community. People are slow to vote away their good money in the full knowledge that a large proportion of the amount that should be devoted to building roads will go to enrich a few unscrupulous contractors and conniving office holders. In this matter as in others affecting the welfare of our people business principles must sooner or later come to prevail. Why should not a city conduct its business on principles similar to those which guide the careful and progressive business man in his private affairs?"

The defaulting Chicago banker, who ran away with money belonging to churches and breweries, cannot be charged with discrimination in his stealing.

The New York dailies receive so much abuse, that it is really a pleasure to say that not one of them approves the proposed \$200,000,000 war tax, which is being pushed by a lot of politicians.

The superstitious find something alarming in the sudden death of the second sculptor engaged in making the Dewey triumphal arch in New York City. Both men dropped dead without warning.

According to a statement issued by the War Department, the Cuban revenues for the first six months of the year paid all the expenses of the military occupation and left a surplus of more than a million dollars.

GOEBEL of Kentucky has warned his opponents that after the election, win or lose, he will have business to transact with those who have denounced him as a liar, a scoundrel and a murderer. Goebel's friends say there will be at least three duels after the election.

GOVERNOR BUSHNELL of Ohio expresses the belief that the contest for presidency next year will be much closer than it was in 1896. Democrats have figured that a change of 25,000 properly distributed that year would have elected their candidate. Anything closer than that would prove to be uncomfortable.

No bond issue is ever so popular as one for the increase of public school facilities. It is well for the future of the republic that this is so. No matter how low down a man may be or how unscrupulous as a politician, he knows well that to antagonize the public schools would mean to array against himself the entire community. General education is the worst foe to political corruption, and it is only fear that causes a certain class of demagogues to champion free education. Not that they will be sufferers, perhaps, but their successors can not stand against an enlightened public opinion.

CAPT. MARK L. HERSEY of the Twelfth U. S. Infantry, who is home on a leave of absence from Manila, gave some opinions about the Filipinos, which are not of the usual run, says the Southern Messenger. Asked what sort of folks the Filipinos are, the captain said: "They are far from being the ignorant men that they have been represented to be. They are not idol worshippers, but belong to the Catholic church, and are well grounded in the tenets of their belief. They are an intelligent people, a part of them being able to read and write. In my army experience I have come in contact with the Mexican granger and the Cuban. From what I saw and heard while at Manila, I have no hesitation in saying that they are the superior of either of these people. They are men of education and refinement." "Are they competent to govern themselves?" he was next asked, and to that he replied: "Well, the Mexicans have succeeded very well in that direction, and I see no reason why the Filipinos shouldn't, inasmuch as I believe them far more intelligent than the former." Asked what field there was in the Philippines for Protestant missionary work, the captain said: "Well, they might just as well send missionaries to convert the people of Spain, there is just as much chance to make converts."
