A DELAYED SENTENCE.

A well known woman of an enthusiastic turn of mind made an eloquent appeal to Governor Murphy on behalf of the Malderman convicts. The appeal was refused, the governor giving his reasons and stating that the guilt of the condemned men had been proved.

This, of course, now, is known. The unfortunate men acknowledged their guilt, but the question arises whether, in the face of the sentence and of the obvious guilt of the men, this delay in the execution should have been.

It was the intention of the executive to permit the ultimate carrying out of the carefully considered sentence of the court, and it was obviously cruel to buoy up by these frequent interpositions the minds of the men, until they expected an ultimate certain release from the death sentence.

They were kept in their cell, with all the anxieties attending the horror of their position, for weeks, and then when the political aspect of the matter was removed they were taken out and hanged.

That the sentence was a popular one is, of course, undoubted, but an unnecessary prolongation of the agony of doubt and the misery of the condemned cell was unparadonable cruelty.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Pearl Gold Mining Company.

Know all men by these presents that we, N. E. Ferguson, F. G. Gwynn and J. M. O'Connell, of the town of Bisbee, county of Cochise, Territory of Arizona, have this day associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the Territory of Arizona, and we do hereby certify and adopt the following articles of incorporation.

ARTICLE I.

The name of this corporation shall be "The Pearl Gold Mining Company," and its principal place of transacting business shall be at the town of Bisbee, county of Cochise, Territory of Arizona.

ARTICLE II.

The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted is to own, possess, develop, mine, buy, sell and lease mines and mining property, to mill and reduce ores, either by milling or smelting, chlorination, cyanide process or otherwise, from the mines owned or operated by this company, or for others; to locate and acquire by purchase water rights for the purpose of using the same, or for the sale of water; to own, by purchase or otherwise, lands or real estate, and to sell the same; to buy, sell and deal in personal property and merchandise of every description, and generally to do and perform any and all acts necessary or incidental to its business as aforesaid.

ARTICLE III.

The amount of the capital stock of this corporation shall be Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000), divided into fifty thousand (50,000) shares, of the par value of One Dollar (\$1.00) each, to be paid in at the time of issuance of stock in the discretion of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV.

The time of the commencement of this corporation shall be the date of the filing of these articles in the office of the Recorder of the county of Cochise, Territory of Arizona, and the termination thereof shall be twenty-five years thereafter.

ARTICLE V.

The affairs of this corporation shall be conducted by a board of four directors, to be elected annually on the first Monday in March of each year, who shall be stockholders of this corporation, and said board of directors shall elect from their own number the following officers, to-wit: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and General Manager. The board of directors shall adopt by-laws which shall define the duties of such officers, the time of their election, the time of the meetings of said board, and such other matters as the board of directors may deem proper. The following named persons are hereby appointed to serve as board of directors until their successors are duly elected: N. E. Ferguson, J. P. Bander, F. G. Gwynn and J. M. O'Connell.

ARTICLE VI.

The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which this corporation is at any time to subject itself is the sum of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000).

ARTICLE VII.

The private property of the stockholders shall be exempt from all corporate debts and liabilities. In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our hands this 30th day of October, A. D. 1900.
