ORDINANCE NO. 233.

Repealing Ordinance No. 118, Heretofore Passed, Granting to J. J. Gardiner the Right and Privilege to Lay Down Water and Gas Pipes Along

and Over the Streets, Alleys and Pavements of the City of Phoenix. The Common Council of Phoenix do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 118 heretofore passed by the Common Council of Phoenix, granting to J. J. Gardiner the right and privilege to lay down water and gas pipes along and over the streets, alleys and pavements of the City of Phoenix, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This ordinance to take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 232.

To regulate the speed at which bicycles may be ridden in the streets of the City of Phoenix.

The Common Council of Phoenix do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Any person or persons who shall ride any bicycle, upon and through the streets of the City of Phoenix, at a rate of speed to exceed eight miles per hour, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars, and in case said fine is not paid, the person or persons convicted, shall be imprisoned in the City Jail until said fine is satisfied at the rate of one day's imprisonment for each dollar of said fine.

Sec. 2. This ordinance to be in force and effect from and after its passage and publication according to law.

Passed by the Common Council this 3d day of October, 1896.
