An Ordinance to Amend an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to Provide Measures for More Plainly and Definitely Marking the Streets of Phoenix for the Convenience of the Public" numbered ordinance 121.

SECTION I. That section one of an ordinance entitled "An ordinance to provide measures for more definitely and plainly marking the streets of Phoenix for the convenience of the public" be and the same is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION II. This Ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and publication as by law required.
