Ordinance No. 179.

An Ordinance to Amend Ordinance No. 100, Entitled an Ordinance in Revision of the Ordinances of the City of Phoenix, and to Establish Provision for the Government of Said City.

The Common Council of Phoenix do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1—That section 4 of chapter 1, article 1, of an ordinance entitled An Ordinance in Revision of the Ordinances of the City of Phoenix, and to establish provision for the government of said city be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any minor to visit, hang around or loiter in or about any bawdy house, billiard room, drinking saloon, bar or other place where intoxicating liquors are sold.
SEC. 2—Subdivision 14 of section 1 of article 1 of chapter 1, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Riding or driving any animal through the streets at a rate of speed exceeding six miles per hour.

That section 3 of chapter 1 of article 1 be amended to read as follows:

SEC. 3—Every person who shall carry on the business of laundry or wash house within the limits of that part of the city heretofore designated and set apart as fire limits under ordinance No. 70, entitled "An ordinance to amend section 1 of ordinance No. 44, entitled 'an ordinance to provide for the protection of persons and property in the city of Phoenix from damage by fire,'" shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and all such laundries and wash-houses are hereby declared to be a nuisance.

SEC. 4—All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage and publication as by law required.
