MISSOURI MULE VERSUS THE GASOLINE WAGON

Much has been said and written about the Missouri mule. Envious residents of other states have even intimated that the Missourian and the mule are so closely allied that there is a marked resemblance in looks and disposition. This of course, is a slander, but we are proud of our long eared hybrid just the same. It is nothing unusual for a good team of mules to sell at \$200 and upward, but when they double up on that figure there is comment even in Missouri. A span of raw three-year-olds sold at the American Royal for an even thousand dollars. This is a record for Kansas City. Before the show was over a world's record had been established. A yearling mule sold for \$550, more money than had ever been paid for a mule of that age before.

Probably just as valuable animals are raised in other states, but they lack the prestige, and the Missouri farmer gets the ash. Imagine a Kansan or a man from Illinois selling a yearling mule for over half a thousand dollars. The idea is preposterous.

A mule buyer purchased these fancy songsters. He expects to make money on his investment, and it is reasonable to suppose that he knows his business. When you come to think the matter over the price is not exorbitant after all. That three-year-old span will be good for twenty years of service and will earn many times over the original sum paid for them.

You pay \$1000 for an automobile and in a few years at the most it is consigned to the scrap heap. Gasoline bills, repair bills, doctor bills, have all added to the first cost of this expensive luxury. Better pin your faith to the Missouri mule.—Missouri Ruralist.

Kansas City Market Letter

Kansas City Stock Yards, March 2, 1914. Cattle receipts last week were 4000 head less than previous week, and 8000 less than corresponding week last year. The reduction was largely due to hampered shipping facilities, account of the storm, and the result was an advance of 15 to 35 cents on killing grades. After Wednesday there was a slight weakness on killing kinds, as buyers expected good receipts this week. Stockers and feeders grew stronger as the week progressed, and sentiment was universal that the market was bidding a last farewell to its low spot. Receipts today are 12,000 head and the market on killers is steady to weak, stockers and feeders strong to 10 higher. The first estimate for today was 13,000, and the market firmed up a little when it became known that the supply would fall short of the estimate. A trade secret, which is having some effect on the willingness of buyers to make purchases today, is that cattle always take on good fills immediately before and immediately after a storm, but light fills a week or ten days after a storm, hence cattle bought today are expected to show better dressing results than similar cattle bought last week. No prime natives are here today, but they are quotable up to 9.25, fair to good natives today at 7.40 to 8.70 western pulp and hay fed steers 7.50 to 8.30, pulp cows 6.90, fancy native cows worth 7.75, Panhandle killing steers today 8.30, Oklahoma 7.25 to 8.30, Panhandle stock calves 8.00. Only 10 cars quarantine cattle arrived, including steers at 7.05 to 7.25, cows 5.00 to 6.35. Stockers and feeders bring 6.25 to 7.80, and this class of cattle are expected to make further advances this month.

Hogs sold about steady today, with some weakness on light weights at the close. Order buyers paid 8.60 for heavy and middle weights, but packers top was 8.55, bulk of sales 8.30 to 8.45. The market is a see-saw affair, but as long as Eastern demand continues of present volume, prices, generally speaking, will hold up firm. Eastern demand took almost 20 per cent of the hogs here during February.

Sheep and lambs weakened after Thursday last week, and the market is 10 to 15 lower today receipts 8,200. The main average feature is good runs at the Northern markets, together with the knowledge, in possession of buyers, that Northern Colorado alone will ship around 70,000 sheep and lambs this week. This number will overflow the market hopper at Northern markets, and the moderate number in sight for this point should sell well, in comparison. Lambs brought 7.55 today, yearlings 6.75, wethers 5.75, ewes 5.50.
