The report of the County Recorder for the month of March 1916, showing the collection of fees to the amount of \$252.15 and treasurer's receipt for the same, was checked with the fee book, found to be correct and same

was approved. The report of the County School Supt. for the quarter ending March 31st, 1916, was approved.

The report of the Custodian of the Bright Angel Trail for the month of March, 1916, showing the collection of tolls to the amount of \$378.00 and treasurer's receipt for the same, was approved.

The time report of the Custodian of the Bright Angel Trail for the month of March 1916, showing the number of men employed and the time, was approved.

The Sheriff's expense report for the month of March, 1916, showing the

expenditure of \$163.05 and refund treasurer's receipt for \$336.95, was checked, found to be correct and same was approved.

The Sheriff's civil report for the month of March, 1916, showing the collection of fees to the amount of \$31.00 and treasurer's receipt for the same was checked and approved.

The Sheriff's report showing refund on script book No. A204484 to the amount of \$25.85 and treasurer's receipt for the same, was approved.

The report of A. W. Brown, justice of the peace at Fredonia, for the month of February, 1916, showing the collection of fines to the amount of \$10.00 and treasurer's receipt for the same, was approved.

The report of the Custodian of Lees Ferry for the period ending March 23rd, 1916, showing the collection of tolls to the amount of \$9.50 and treasurer's receipt for the same was approved.

The report of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors for the month of March, 1916, showing the collection of \$30.00 on account of the sale of hides and treasurer's receipt for the same was approved.

The report of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors for the month of March, 1916, showing the collection of \$10.00 rental from the Bright Angel residence and treasurer's receipt for the same, was approved.

The report of the County Assessor for the month of March, 1916, showing the expenditure of \$6.33 and refund treasurer's receipt for \$43.67, was checked and approved.

The report of the County Assessor for the month of March, 1916, showing the collection of personal property taxes to the amount of \$179.31, and the collection of school (poll) tax to the amount of \$27.50 and treasurer's receipt for the same, was checked and approved.

The report of C. W. Hart, supt. of the county hospital for the month of March, 1916, showing the number of indigents housed and cared for, was approved.

The report of the County Chauffeur for the month of March, 1916, was approved.

The report of Ira Brown, deputy assessor for the Fredonia district, was approved.

The chairman of the board of supervisors reported the following Notary bonds as having been approved during the month of March, 1916: X. N. Steeves, Edward A. Phillips and Robt. J. Kidd.

A demand made by the Saginaw & Manistee Lumber Co. for \$37.50, was not allowed.

The board, together with the county attorney then proceeded to count the money in the treasury and turned in the following verified report:

The amount of money that ought to be in the treasury is \$48,721.02.

The amount of money actually in the treasury is \$48,721.02.

That the kind of money is, gold, \$30.00.

Silver, \$42.10.

Currency, \$140.00.

Cash items, \$8,315.34.

Amount deposited in the Arizona Central Bank and interest being paid to the county upon such deposit \$18,572.56, less outstanding checks of \$368.53—\$18,204.03.

Amount deposited in the Citizens Bank and interest being paid to the county thereon \$15,803.52.

Amount deposited in the Williams State Bank and interest being paid to the county thereon \$6,086.03.

The rate of interest the county receives is two per cent per annum on the daily balances, credited to the county monthly.

We further depose and say that not more than three months have elapsed since the last counting of such moneys was made as required by law.

This counting was made on the 3rd day of April, A. D. 1916.

The assigned claim of R. M. Reese in the sum of \$55.00 was not allowed.

The report of F. O. Twitty, for the month of February and March, 1916, showing the expenditures of \$60.00 out door relief in the cases of Chas. Bonner and John Hurley and receipts for the same, was approved.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Board adjourned till Tuesday, April 4th, 1916.

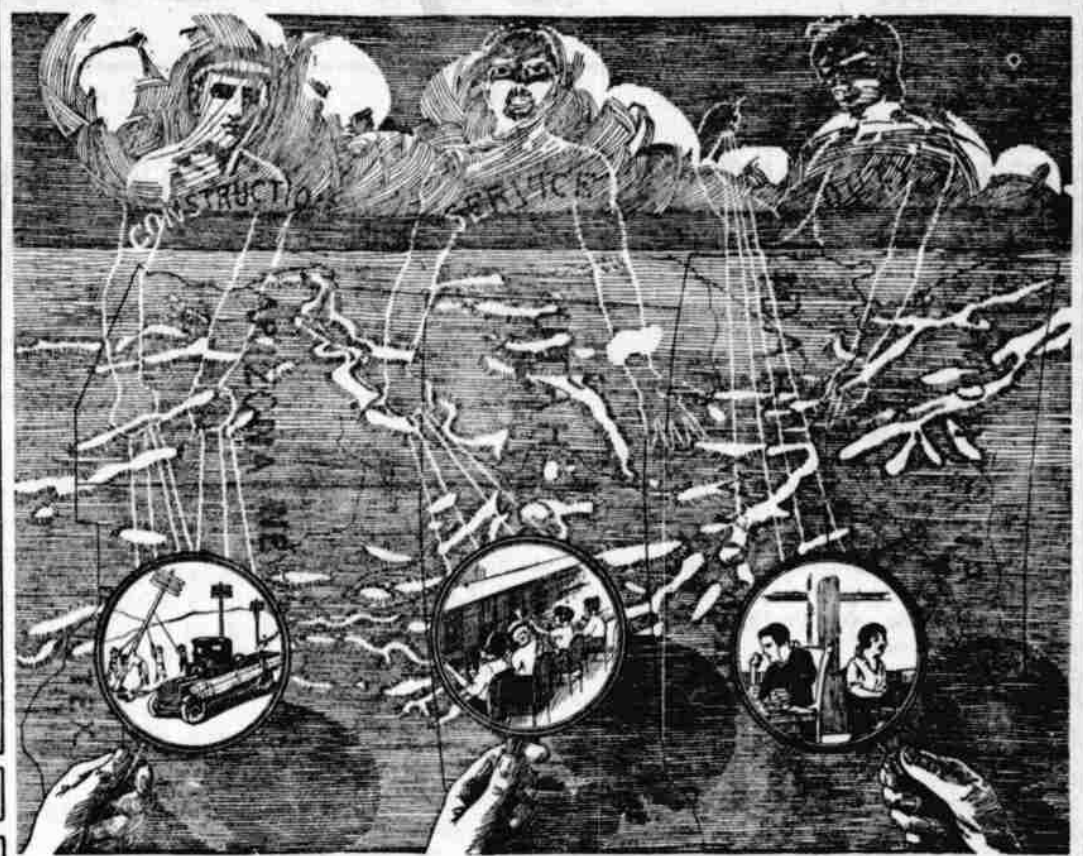
Pursuant to adjournment, the Board met today. Present, Chairman Hart, Members Woolfolk and Brown, Attorney Wilson and Clerk Rees.
