MULLANAX WOMAN TO BE HEARD THURSDAY

Slayer of Husband Probably Will Plead Self Defense; Victim to Be Buried Here

Mrs. Momie Mullanax, who shot her husband to death near the side last week, was brought before Justice of the Peace Johnstone yesterday and her arraignment in superior court was set for Thursday morning. It is considered certain that the young

woman will offer self defense as the reason for the shooting. She alleges that her husband sprang toward her while she was getting her belongings in their tent and that she shot to save herself from harm.
Claude Mullanax, the victim, will not be buried in his home in Lead Hill, Ark. A telegram has been received from his father. The father states that he has no money with which to bring his boy back home for burial. Mullanax saved a little money while in Phoenix and this will be used to defray funeral expenses.
Dr. L. B. Wiggins, the Texas physician who killed Tap Booth in Tempe one day after the Mullanax trag-

edy, probably will be brought into Justice court Monday morning to have the date of his preliminary examination fixed.
Zach Booth, father of Tap, is due in Phoenix this week. He has notified friends in Phoenix that he will take an active part in prosecuting the slayer of his son.
