## PARKER LAND MAY OPEN UP INSIDE YEAR

Appropriation for Survey in Bill Which Hayden Believes Will Pass in December—Big Survey is Necessary

In spite of departmental indifference, Representative Carl Hayden believes it is possible to get through a bill calling for a survey of the proposed Colorado river Indian irrigation project. A bill already has been introduced, simultaneously in the house and senate, providing for a survey and appropriating \$100,000 for it.

Plans already suggested for the improvement of the Colorado river with a diversion dam near Headgate Rock, Parker, Arizona, have been turned down as impracticable by the department of the interior, on the ground that there is not enough accurate data on hand to induce private capital or public enterprise to undertake the work. The failure of many Carey act projects, the impoverishing of the settlers and the ruin of the promoters is pointed out. It is said it would not be fair to open the Indian lands in their present arid condition, nor under any reclamation plan unless there is a reasonable assurance that water could be made available for the irrigation of the lands at a reasonable cost.

Additional borings and other investigations of the site will be necessary before any definite plans can be made. Furthermore, there are no surveys for irrigation canals or structures incident to proper irrigation of the lands on the reservation. Still, the department backs up the suggestion of an appropriation of the hundred thousand for the further study of the damsite and bottom lands. In case a fund is secured, the work will be conducted jointly by the reclamation and Indian services. Mr. Hayden in a letter to the board of trade says he believes the bills will go through at the December session of congress, when other Indian
