The actual operating, maintenance and repair cost of each unit shall be levied equally against the shares then outstanding of the series appurtenant to the lands served or that is entitled to be served by such unit and such assessment shall be a lien upon the lands to which such shares are appurtenant. The manner of making such assessments, provided for in this and the next preceding Article, and enforcing the collection thereof shall be prescribed by the By-Laws.
ARTICLE IV
As an incident to the ownership of each share of the several series of the capital stock of this corporation, and as evidence thereof, such share holder shall be entitled to have delivered to him for the irrigation of each acre of his land to which such share is appurtenant, that proportion of all the water made available for delivery to such acre of land that such acre bears to the whole number of acres to which shares of this corporation of that particular series are made appurtenant, all upon the same conditions and terms and subject to the same rules and regulations.
ARTICLE V
The affairs of this corporation are to be conducted by a Board of Directors to consist of seven members who shall be stockholders, and by a President, Vice-president, Secretary and Treasurer.
The duties and powers of the President, Vice-president, Secretary and Treasurer shall be those usually incident to such office, and such other as the Board of Directors may by By-Laws impose.
The first Board of Directors shall serve for the term of five years from the date hereof, and shall be composed of John Schrock, Eugene Kelly, J. R. Detweiler, C. H. Rittenhouse, Wm. H. Renck, O. S. Stapley and Paul B. Beville. The Board may fill any vacancies in its membership. After the expiration of the term of office of the members of the Board of Directors above named, the term
