**ASSOCIATION IS NOT FOR FANCYERS ALONE**

Organization Has Broad Scope and Much Usefulness.

Secretary H. G. Powers of the Arizona State Poultry association in an interview states that "there is an erroneous impression prevailing regarding the purpose of the Arizona State Poultry association. Some people seem to be under the impression," says Mr. Powers, "that the association is for the benefit of the breeders of fancy poultry, but such is not the case. At each of our three annual shows one of the features has been the exhibits of commercial eggs, and it is the intention to introduce a resolution at the annual meeting to be held at the Board of Trade next Saturday to make a law regarding cold storage more stringent."

It is manifestly unfair to the producer who is running a commercial egg farm, or to the farmer who keeps poultry as a side line, to have to sell his fresh eggs in the winter season in competition with the eggs from Kansas and Missouri, which have been kept in cold storage. It is, of course, legal and perfectly right for dealers to handle these eggs, but it is only fair to the consumer as well as to the producer of fresh eggs, that cold storage products of all kinds should be labeled in such a manner that the consumer will know what he is buying.

Several states have laws requiring restaurants and hotels using cold storage products to display a placard in their dining rooms stating that cold storage products are used. The association will make a strong effort to have satisfactory laws passed which will benefit the poultry keeper who is making his money from eggs rather than fancy poultry.

The regular monthly meetings throughout the year will be largely experience meetings, and will benefit the practical farmer who has poultry as a side line quite as much as the regular poultry breeder who is making a specialty of breeding birds for the show room.

It is important that every one who is interested in making poultry profitable should attend the annual meeting.
