"WATERMELON KING" OF THE RIO GRANDE

S. M. Bryan of New Mexico Anxious to Secure Location Near Mesa.

Determined to become identified with the agricultural interests of the Salt River valley and to introduce methods of growing watermelons along new lines, S. M. Bryan has arrived in Mesa and is looking around with the idea of making a selection of forty or sixty acre tract which will be devoted exclusively to the growth of watermelons and cantaloupes.

It should be remarked in passing that while Mr. Bryan is recently from New Mexico he was formerly from Georgia and that particular section of Georgia where the agriculturists knew nothing better than the production of watermelons.

However, Mr. Bryan is not only a grower of watermelons, but he expects to plant several acres to the Chinese sugar melon, a variety of the cantaloupes larger than the Rocky Ford, and according to the gentleman a great many times sweeter. He is of the opinion that this grade of melon has never been grown at this place and he, if he can secure a location, will put them on the market. He claims many things for the ground.
