## FLAGSTAFF WILL CELEBRATE.

The Nation's Birthday to Be Fittingly Observed.

The Skylight City Preparing for a Monster Celebration—Excursion to the Grand Canyon.

Flagstaff has decided to celebrate the nation's holiday. As July 4 comes on Sunday, the festivities will not begin until Monday morning, July 5.

Great interest is taken in the affair, and the business men and citizens generally will contribute liberally to the expenses of the celebration.

The race course south of town at the fair grounds will be fixed up. Horse races, bicycle races, running races, etc., will be given. A special reduced rate excursion to the Grand Canyon of the Colorado, trips to the Ice Caves, Cliff Dwellings, Sunset Peaks, Walnut Canyon, etc., will be made and every convenience, comfort and entertainment will be provided. It is aimed to keep up the festivities for at least two days. Neither money nor effort will be spared in making this celebration the grandest and best ever held in Arizona.

The best band to be had will be provided and furnish amusement for the carnival. Although there are but two months between now and the Fourth it is sufficient time to make all

preparations and arrangements.

The Atlantic & Pacific branch of the order of Locomotive Firemen will come, three or four hundred strong, and special trains will be run from Williams and Winslow to Flagstaff. A large crowd is promised from Albuquerque, and Phoenix will send up half her population, while Prescott, Tucson, and Yuma will be numerously represented.

The climate at this time of year is ideal, and Flagstaff presents great natural advantages for the entertainment of its visitors.

Ample hotel accommodations will be provided, and the rates are lower in comparison to the service than in any other town in the Southwest.

A great deal of work has to be done in the way of providing entertainment, etc. and committees will soon be out soliciting subscriptions and arranging for the building of pavilions and other structures necessary.

The Skylight City does nothing by halves and from the great interest already shown, the monster celebration on July 5 will be the biggest affair of the kind ever held in Arizona.
