

DEMOCRATIC AGENTS.

The Primaries Saturday - A Fair Vote and Peaceful Proceedings - The Result in Tombstone, Charleston, Contention, Benson, Etc.

The Democratic primaries Saturday were conducted in an orderly spirit, and notwithstanding the clashing of conflicting interests, the best of good feeling prevailed. There was a warm interest taken in the election all over the city, and every man with Democratic antecedents and proclivities was more or less anxious as to the result. There was no heated personal fight made on any one man, though a number of old time Democrats were anxious to take up the maxim of the EPIGRAPH that none but Democrats be placed on guard. Of course there were many warm discussions, and the friends of the opposing candidates did a good deal of tongue fighting, still there was nothing that the clear-headed construction could construe into a quarrel, and when the battle was over, all were friends again. The result in this city cannot be called a victory for any one man. In fact no man can say that he is absolutely certain that any one delegate elected will vote for him in the convention. This is really how the matter stands. The delegates chosen are all good Democrats, and will cheerfully vote and support the nominees of the county convention, notwithstanding their personal predilections. It may fairly be assumed that no man was a personal victory. Mr. Neagle will go into the convention with one vote, secured in the second ward. Outside of that, we do not know that any delegate elected is pledged to any one man, but all will support straight Democratic candidates, and will not go outside the party for a nominee.

The Third ward was perhaps the most warmly contested. There were two tickets in the field, each bearing the names of honorable men and steadfast Democrats. Mr. Archer's name was on both tickets, and of course, as may be imagined under such circumstances, he was rushed through with an immense majority. The so-called Neagle ticket in this ward was strengthened by having the name of such a thorough Democrat, and universally popular man as Nicholas Kenealy to float it. It may be understood, however, that Mr. Kenealy is a Democrat, first, last and all the time, and though defeated, the use of his name was a tower of strength to the ticket with which he was identified. In the Second Ward the contest was very tame, and only very little interest was taken in the proceedings. The First Ward was contested rather vigorously for a part of the day, but towards evening interest in the proceedings began to lag and there was no special effort set forth toward the last. The delegates chosen are staunch Democrats and will support only well defined members of that party for a nomination. The Fourth Ward was somewhat complicated in consequence of there being two polling places. One of the clubs was looked upon with suspicion by many, in consequence of the officers of the club having hermetically sealed the rolls, and refused to shed the light of publication on the pages. The second ward club was organized in accordance with the suggestion of the County Central Committee, and there is hardly a doubt but that the best Democrats in the ward affiliated with the new organization. The figures given below will show the reader that a majority of the voters of the ward exercised their right of suffrage at Number Two.

Unlike the day on which the Republican primaries were held, there were no unseemly quarrels; none of the Democratic leaders were hauled off to jail, and none of them will be fined to-day. This is a contrast that the average voter may call to his mind the next time the Republicans are referred to as the party of moral ideas. Below we give the result of the primaries, so far as ascertained:

PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

The Enabling Election—Only Two Supervisors and Two Clerks. The following proclamation by the Governor was Saturday received by Recorder Jones. It will be seen that only two Supervisors are to be elected, which a good many people think is an error: ELECTION PROCLAMATION. To all whom it may concern, greeting: Whereas, under an act of the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Arizona, entitled "An Act to Provide for General and Special Elections," it is provided that there shall be held throughout the Territory of Arizona on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November, A. D. 1882, an election for members of the Legislative Assembly, and such other officers as may be required by law to be chosen at such election; and, whereas, it is further provided in said act that it shall be the duty of the Governor, at least thirty (30) days before any general election, to issue his proclamation designating the officers to be filled at such election. Now, therefore, I, F. A. Trille, Governor of the Territory of Arizona, in pursuance of the duty enjoined upon me do hereby order a general election to be held on the day named in said act, to wit: the seventh day of November, A. D. 1882, and designate the officers to be filled at said election as follows, to-wit: One (1) delegate to the Forty-eighth Congress of the United States. Twelve (12) members of the Council of the Legislative Assembly of the Territory. Twenty-four (24) members of the House of Representatives of the Legislative Assembly of the Territory.

Appointed under the act of the Legislature, entitled "An Act to provide for the taking of the census of and in the several counties of the Territory of Arizona," approved March 11th, 1881, as follows: MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL. Apache county, one (1) member; Cochise county, one (1) member; Coconino county, one (1) member jointly; Maricopa and Gila counties, one (1) member jointly; Pima county, two (2) members; Pinal and Pinal counties, one (1) member jointly; Yuma and Mohave counties, one (1) member jointly; Yavapai county, four (4) members.

MEMBERS HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. Apache county, one (1) member; Cochise county, three (3) members; Maricopa county, two (2) members; Pima county, five (5) members; Mohave county, one (1) member; Graham county, one (1) member; Pinal county, one (1) member; Gila county, one (1) member; Yuma county, one (1) member; Yavapai county, eight (8) members. Also there shall be elected in each county of the Territory two (2) members of the Board of Supervisors, one (1) Sheriff, one (1) District Attorney, one (1) County Recorder, one (1) Probate Judge, one (1) County Treasurer, one (1) County Surveyor, two (2) Coroners, and a Public Administrator. Also, in each election precinct in each county one (1) and not more than two (2) Constables. Also in each township two (2) Justices of the Peace; and where more than eight hundred persons reside in a township, to be ascertained by the Board of Supervisors, one (1) additional Justice may be elected. Also, in each school district in each county three (3) School Trustees. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the great seal of the Territory of Arizona. Done at Prescott this 29th day of August, A. D. 1882. F. A. TRILLE, Governor of Arizona. A. T. SECRETARY OF TERRITORY.
