### SENSATIONAL AFFAIR

#### Railway Superintendent Arrested at Fort Thomas Yesterday

Imbued with the spirit of hostility to railway corporations which is so prevalent throughout the country at this time, the judicial authorities of the town of Fort Thomas, in Graham county, tried to take a fall out of the Gila Valley, Globe & Northern railway yesterday. C. C. Mallard, the popular young superintendent of the trunk line which plies between Globe and Bowie, got off at Fort Thomas yesterday for a visit between trains. As is well known, one of Mr. Mallard's characteristics is neatness, and when he saw an unsightly looking bit of paper pasted on the depot, which is the sacred property of the railroad, he immediately tore it off. The town bull happened along just at this time and he immediately pinched the operating head of the Goes Very Gently & Nervously, as the paper he yanked off the consecrated shack was a legal notice. Mr. Mallard promised to go to the office of the chief justice of the peace without resistance and the T. B. refrained from adjusting the bracelets to the wrists of the superintendent, although he kept his hand on his hip pocket.

On arraignment Mr. Mallard pleaded that he did not know the enormity of his offense and besides it was committed while he was temporarily suffering from hyperbolic paranoia superinduced by the unusual excitement in Fort Thomas caused by the public sale of a brindle calf on the main street. In answer to a hypothetical question put by the justice he stated that he would replace the mutilated notice, which was done under supervision of the police force, and the superintendent was released from custody on payment of the costs, amounting to \$1.35, an officer of the court accompanying Mr. Mallard to Globe last evening to get change for a \$5 bill tendered by the magistrate.

The affair caused considerable excitement at Fort Thomas and it will be the sole topic of conversation for many days to come. While refusing to speak for publication last evening, Mr. Mallard deprecated the hostility being displayed toward the railroads by important officials throughout the country. As his incarceration was merely nominal, he feels no severe effects.

Of the 250 passengers but forty-seven were saved.

Locally the market was quiet and unchanged, with Lake at 25.37 1/2 to 25.75; Electrolytic, 25.12 1/2 to 25.37 1/2; and Casting, 24.27 1/2 to 24.87 1/2. Lead was unchanged at 119 13s 9d in the London market and 6.00 to 6.30 locally. Spelter was lower at £26 5s in the London market and 6.00 to 6.30 locally. Iron was 3d higher in the English market, with standard foundry quoted at 54s 6d and Cleveland warrant 54s 4 1/2d. Locally the market was unchanged. Bar silver, 66 3/4. Mexican dollars, 51 1/4.

#### NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

Revised Statutes of Arizona, 1901, 3848 (Sec. 18). It shall be the duty of every person owning, or having charge of, or under his control, property in this Territory subject to taxation, and in this title provided, to make out and deliver to the Assessor, between the first Monday in February and the first Monday in June, in each year, a correct list of the same, as required by law, whether he shall receive from the Assessor a notice or demand to do so or not; and every assessment made against property subject to taxation shall be valid, whether such notice or demand was received or not.

Personal property taxes must be paid when assessed, unless secured by real estate.
