

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF CITIZENS LOAN AND TRUST COMPANY

Know All Men by These Presents: That we, D. F. Williamson, Jos. H. Hamill, J. J. Keegan, Leroy Middleton, J. P. Bosch, J. F. Hechtman, C. T. Sturgeon, Patrick Rose, George F. Briggs, A. G. Smith and F. G. Hanna, all of Globe, County of Gila and Territory of Arizona, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the Territory of Arizona, and for this purpose we do hereby declare and adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I.

The names of the incorporators are D. F. Williamson, Jos. H. Hamill, J. J. Keegan, Leroy Middleton, J. P. Bosch, J. F. Hechtman, C. T. Sturgeon, Patrick Rose, George F. Briggs, A. G. Smith and F. G. Hanna. The name of this corporation shall be and is CITIZENS LOAN AND TRUST COMPANY. The principal place of transacting the business of this corporation shall be and is at Globe, County of Gila and Territory of Arizona, at which place the meetings of the stockholders and directors shall be held, provided, that branch offices may be established at such places, either within or without the Territory of Arizona, as may at any time be determined by the Board of Directors, where the meetings of the stockholders and directors may be held, and at such places any and all business may be transacted which may not be in conflict with the Laws of the Territory of Arizona, or the Laws of any such State or Territory where the branch offices may be maintained.

ARTICLE II.
