OLD DOMINION EARNING MONEY

Find of Ore on the 16th Level Shows Mine Is in Its Infancy.

Upon his return to Boston from his recent visit to Globe, C. S. Smith, president of the Old Dominion Copper Mining and Smelting Co., gave the following interview to the Boston News Bureau:

"If on final hearing the opinion of Judge Sheldon is affirmed, the former stockholders of the Old Dominion Copper Mining & Smelting Co. of New Jersey will share in such dividend as may be declared, from the recovery.

It. We have not been able to develop it as yet. The ore is of a better quality than at the same point on the 14th level.

"This 200-foot winze is only a bucket winze but is large enough for cage equipment, and we are now installing such equipment."

"We are now running a crosscut from the winze on the 15th level so as to get down and have proper ventilation. It will probably be a month before we are able to do any noteworthy development on the 16th level, but we now know that the ore is there."

"We have got our costs down to the minimum under present operating conditions and are earning money. We have two or three years' supply of high grade ore ahead at the present rate of production, so we are not 'gutting' the mine."

"The Globe Bank & Savings Co. pays 4 per cent on term deposits, 6 to 8 per cent on escrow deposits and wants escrow loans on real estate and first-class securities."

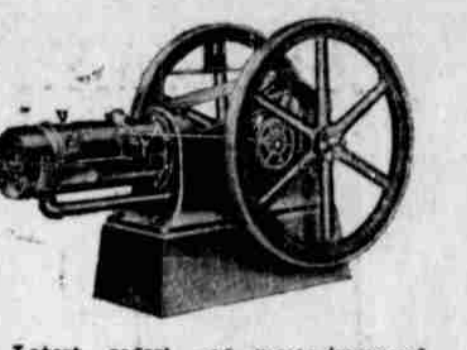
