LORIMER FORCES LOSE CHICAGO, April 9.—Incomplete returns from the Illinois primary election indicate that Theodore Roosevelt led Taft about two and a half to one, and that Champ Clark's vote is approximately twice that of Governor Ison.

Col. Cauncey Dewey, head of the state Roosevelt organization, gave out a statement declaring that the former president had carried Illinois by 150,000, and that while the proportion of his vote to that of Taft is two and a half to one, in places
