Brief Territorial News

The well-known Spencer C. Cherry mine in Verde Valley has been sold to William F. Wingfield, of Camp Verde, for a consideration of \$8,000. The deal includes title to 110 acres, water rights, rights of way for the mine and other privileges.

Work on the Santa Rita mine has been opened from the surface of the mine in that region and renewed activity as a result. The stamp mill at the Boyd mine is in operation by March.
