## Brief Territorial News

The Sells-Floto circus drew good crowds at Douglas Monday.  
 Phoenix is planning to build a separate school for the accommodation of colored pupils.  
 Three small shacks on International avenue were destroyed by fire in Douglas Monday afternoon.  
 The nineteenth annual session of the Arizona Medical association is being held in Phoenix this week.  
 The yearly encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic, Arizona department, is being held at Phoenix this week.  
 The annual report of the Calumet and Arizona Mining company for 1909 shows total receipts of \$5,054,664 for the year.  
 The Copper Queen company at Bisbee will hold out \$2 as county road tax from the April pay checks of all its employees.  
 Four women autoists were arrested in Phoenix the other day for exceeding the speed limit. Capital City fair sex is going some.  
 A special train will be run from Phoenix to Tucson May 5, on the occasion of the big Cinco de Mayo celebration at the Old Pueblo.  
 About forty cases, the largest docket in several years, faces the Maricopa county grand jury, which began its deliberations in Phoenix Monday.  
 A little Mexican boy was run over by a motorcycle ridden by James Wilson in Bisbee Monday and came out of the accident with a broken leg.  
 The fixtures and stock of the old Palace saloon in Phoenix, once the center of sporting in Arizona, were sold at auction the other day. It was established in 1884.  
 James Lamb, a Tombstone lad aged 16, has disappeared. He left his home a few days ago on a hunting trip in the hills, and since that time has not been seen or heard of.  
 A half section of land south of Yuma has been officially set aside by the Washington authorities to be used as a rifle range for the Arizona National guard.  
 A can of condensed milk which he claims made the trip to the North Pole and return with the Peary party is being proudly exhibited by the keeper of a Phoenix grocery store.  
 Bids are being solicited for the construction of the territorial highway link from Phoenix to Prescott. All bids must be in the hands of the board of control at Phoenix by April 25.  
 Herb Robinson has been suspended from the Douglas police force for failure to discover the presence of burglars in the Boston store the other night when more than \$700 worth of goods were stolen.  
 James Daley, who ran away from his home and family at Mesa some months ago with Rhoda Beebe, a 16-year-old girl, and was apprehended in New Mexico and brought back, was indicted on three charges growing out of the affair by the Maricopa county grand jury Tuesday.

 Every male citizen of the United States, and every male citizen of Mexico, who shall have elected to become a citizen of the United States under the Treaty of Peace exchanged and ratified at Queretaro on the 30th day of May, 1848, and the Gadsden Treaty of 1854, of the age of twenty-one years who shall have been a resident of the Territory of Arizona for one year, and of the City of Globe and of the Ward in which he claims his vote for thirty days next preceding said 23rd day of May, 1910, and who, not being prevented by physical disability from so doing, is able to read the Constitution of the United States in the English language in such manner as to show that he is neither prompted nor reciting from memory, and is able to write his own name, and who is not an idiot, an insane person, or a person convicted of a felony, is a qualified elector in said City, and is entitled to registration therein in accordance with the ordinances of said City and the laws of Arizona.  
 The City Clerk of the City of Globe is hereby designated as the Registration officer of said City to have charge of and conduct said registration, and there shall also be appointed and designated said additional registration officers of said City from the Common Council thereof, shall from time to time deem it necessary and proper to appoint, and the place of registration shall be at the City Clerk's office, and at such other places as the Council may see fit hereafter to designate.  
 All qualified electors may register at said Clerk's office, or at such other places as the Council may designate, by making affidavit in writing before said Clerk, or before such registration officer, wherein must be stated and shown every fact entitling such person to registration, and also the facts required to be stated on the great register (except the date and number), but no person shall be registered who is not able to read the Constitution of the United States as above and to sign his own name; and each elector registering shall be entitled to and shall upon demand receive a certificate of registration from the officer registering him.  
 Only the names of persons registered prior to the 13th day of April, 1910, shall be entered on the poll lists used at the Primary Election of April 23rd; and persons offering to vote at said primary shall not be permitted to vote thereat unless their names appear on said poll lists, or unless upon production of a certificate of registration showing registration by them in said City prior to their offering to vote on the day of said primary and subsequent to the date of the passage of this resolution.

**WITNESS IS FINED FOR FAILURE TO APPEAR**  
**Must Pay \$80 for Contempt of Court at Solomonville Yesterday**  
 Special to the Silver Belt.  
**SOLOMONVILLE, April 21.**—Because he failed to appear in court as a witness in the civil suit of the Becker-Franz company vs. the Sierra de Oro Gold Mining & Milling company, J. J. Kennedy was fined \$80 for contempt of court today. It was necessary to issue an attachment for Kennedy, before he appeared in court, the cost of the attachment amounting in a great measure for the severity of the fine.  
 This suit, an action concerning valuable mining property, is being bitterly contested by both the prosecution and the defense and is still on trial before a jury.  
 Holly Miller, a witness in the recent trial of King Reese, who was held to answer to the grand jury for perjury, waived examination in court today.  
 Bail was fixed at \$1,000. The defendant was unable to furnish bail and will be held a prisoner until the next session of the grand jury.  
 In the civil suit of E. B. Van Veen vs. Graham county, an action to collect expenses while acting as court reporter in Solomonville, judgment for the plaintiff in the sum of \$727.99 was entered. This judgment is in accordance with the mandate of the territorial supreme court.
