WACS GO FOR GI BILL OF RIGHTS —

Twenty young ladies from the 1922 SCU Wac Detachment, Fort Huachuca, Arizona, become eligible for discharge Nov 1st, under the Army's point system. These women have seen service at least for 34 months, some more than three years. They have played a very important part in the successful completion of the nations war effort and deserve much praise for their voluntary service.

It is interesting to note that most of them intend to further their education by taking advantage of the GI Bill of Rights which provides schooling at the government's expense. In an interview with many of the girls eligible for discharge, we obtained the following statistics:

Annie B. Dennis, Columbus, Ohio, will study beauty culture teaching in Chicago before returning to Columbus to open a school of beauty culture..... Marjorie Bland, Keokuk, Iowa, will return to school to take up accounting.. Y., will return to school at Columbia U....Virginia Moyer, Ironton, Ohio will enter Howard at the 2nd semester...Ann Seay, Daytona Beach, Fla., will return to her position as a school teacher after a year in school.. Glennye Oliver, Chicago, Ill., will resume her studies at Northwestern where she was majoring in English before entering the service.....Medora Ingram, Jefferson City, Tenn. will enter school

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
